

Major achievements of Phase I

- Greatly contributed to capacity building in countries in special situations including LDCs and SIDS, in alignment with UNDESA/DPADM themes and priorities, and
- Close collaboration with hosting government agency MOI – expression of a positive view of UNPOG's achievements as effective and constructive in promoting e-governance in the region



Major achievements of Phase I

Thematic areas during past 3 years

- E-government for women's empowerment
- Open Government Data (OGD) for DRR
- Enhancing capacities of SIDS
- E-government for enhancing local governance



Some lessons

- Important to adhere to holistic and integrated approach for implementing programme activities;
- Need to expand scope in line with SDGs 16 and 17
- Further engagement with UNDESA/DPADM essential, in both research and CD activities
- Enhanced cooperation with main countries in the region and other intl. organizations
- Need to strengthen collaboration with Korean government and academia; and
- Sustained support for countries in special situations with sustainable and measureable impact
