## Course Background

The Effective National to Local Public Governance for SDG Implementation eLearning course, developed in alignment with UN DESA's objectives, addresses the critical role of coordinated governance in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The success of the SDGs depends on strong, integrated public governance that ensures effective collaboration between national and local governments, as well as engagement with the private and non-profit sectors.

## Course Goals and Outline

UN DESA/DPIDG/UNPOG blended eLearning course aims to strengthen public institutions to facilitate consistent and effective SDG implementation. Participants will explore how national and local authorities coordinate in areas such as planning, policy development, and financial management to drive SDG progress.

In addition to providing a broad understanding of effective national-to-local governance, the course delves into key aspects of SDG localization, including vertical integration, SDG financing, and monitoring and evaluation. By examining case studies and practical tools, learners will gain valuable insights into fostering integrated governance structures that enhance the implementation, oversight, and long-term success of the SDGs.

- **Gained** an understanding of how to promote a whole-of-society approach for national to local planning to ensure effective stakeholder engagement in public governance and leave no one behind.
- **Identified** and applied various innovative financing mechanisms to advance local SDG implementation.
- **Developed** a governance strategy and roadmap on monitoring, evaluating and accelerating SDG implementation at the local level.

## Methodology

This 9-week course combines self-paced learning with interactive live sessions, equipping participants with key concepts and practical strategies for Effective National to Local Public Governance for SDG Implementation.

The course materials are presented in various formats, including text, excel tools, graphs, images, and videos, to enhance engagement and knowledge retention. Participants will complete knowledge checks, contribute to forum discussions, and attend live webinars with experts. Additionally, practical activities will encourage interaction, experience sharing, and the real-world application of concepts learned.

## Course Structure

Each unit is structured with the following elements:

**eLearning Course:** Core, mandatory lessons, delivering the essential content for each module. This includes printable versions, resources, and additional materials such as videos.

**Knowledge Checks:** Multiple-choice quizzes to assess your understanding of the key concepts.

**Discussion Forums:** Platform to discuss course topics, seek clarifications, and exchange ideas with peers and instructors.

**Live Sessions:** Interactive sessions led by course expert, providing deeper insights into the course material and an opportunity to have your questions answered in real-time.

**Feedback Survey:** Your input is invaluable. This survey allows you to share your thoughts on the learning experience, helping DPIDG/UNPOG continuously improve the course quality.

## Learning Resources

The learning resources are the core components of the course, designed to guide you toward achieving the course's learning outcomes. Additional support materials are provided to enhance your learning experience.

### eLearning Course

Through the [UN DESA Digital Learning Platform](#), the Effective National to Local Public Governance for SDG Implementation eLearning Course are the lessons, it introduce the foundational concepts of each unit through modules in an interactive format.

All modules feature interactive tasks, reflections that allow you to stay engaged and self-assess your knowledge.

- Each lesson typically consists of 25 slides, including interactive activities.
- You can pause a lesson at any time, and the system will automatically save your progress so you can resume where you left off.
- A printable version of the lessons is available for offline review.

### Forums Discussions

A user-friendly, informal forum where you can post questions related to the course material and share your insights. There is no right or wrong questions. Everyone is encouraged to collaborate in the forum, add topics of interest, and respond to the questions based on their knowledge and experience. You are encouraged to initiate new discussion threads and actively participate in ongoing conversations. All forums are moderated by an expert to support meaningful dialogue.



## Assessment Tasks

The following activities contribute to your final certificate:

- Knowledge checks: Mandatory quizzes for each module to evaluate comprehension.
- Forum participation: Active involvement in discussion forums enhances learning and contributes to certification.
- Action plan: Final assessment requiring participants to develop an action plan based on course knowledge.

## Study Framework

The course runs from 24 February to 25 April, with an estimated workload of 3-4 hours per week. The flexible structure allows you to plan your learning at your own pace, with all lessons, tasks, and supplementary materials are accessible throughout the e-learning course. You are required to complete all mandatory activities before the course ends.
